### New Business

**Responses to violation Notice –West Main St. Willimantic** I had sent out notices to three property owners located on West Main St., and of these one of them has submitted a detailed response to correct the problem – which is simply to remove the debris blocking the drainage to the catch basin on the adjacent property. They would like to briefly present their response and secure permission to proceed on corrective action.

**Willimantic Waste Paper Co., Inc.** - 185 Recycling Way, Willimantic – At the last meeting, several concerns were raised regarding details of the revised plan showing changes to grading directing the surface water to a new storm water treatment facility. The building will be 15,000 sq. ft. to provide more space for sorting trash indoors. Their Soil Scientist (John Ianni) will provide an updated report addressing the field delineation, and design changes to the out-fall splash pad that have been incorporated into the new plans. In his last report he indicated that the wetlands area to the immediate northwest would have been degraded over time, and the proposed improvements should have a positive effect on the wetlands.

### **Old Business- Fleming Complaint**

At the last meeting, the Commission indicated that you want to walk the site of the complaint, and the property owners want to know when to expect the Board to see the area.
