President Diane Rayhall called the regular meeting of the Windham First Taxing District to order at 1906 hours.

***Approval of the minutes from the Annual Meeting dated April 7, 2014-***

Motion made by George Gillette to accept the minutes as presented, Seconded by Elaine Rogers. Motion accepted unanimously.

***Treasurer's Report-*** Jan Mott presented the treasurer's report with the following account balances and bills to pay: (see report)

Motion made by Elaine Roger to accept the report as read and pay the bills, seconded by George Gillette. Motion accepted unanimously.

***Public Comment -***

Gene Chaine from 275 Scotland Rd., Windham Center expressed some concerns with regards to the budgets for the fire departments. He stated that he was concern that the budgets of two of the departments were very close in cost while one of the departments was approximately 10% smaller. Mr. Chaine stated that he had questioned one of the Directors and that the director was not comfortable answering the questions without proper documentation available. Mr. Chaine stated that he wanted to make it clear that he was not a proponent of a paid fire department. He also suggested that the Board of Directors meet with the fire departments rather than just him to discuss the information. President Rayhall and Director Rogers will be meeting with Mr. Chaine and the three fire department officers and presidents on June 10, 2014 at 7p.m. The invitation was also extended to Tony Fantoli from The Windham Service District. Mr. Chaine would like to know what are some of the fixed costs. President Rayhall has already met with Mr. Chaine at her residence to discuss some of the concerns and questions on fixed costs.

***Guilford Smith Library –***

Afton Seal presented the monthly report for the library. She extended sincere thanks for the new carpet that had been purchased by the District. Mrs. Seal noted that during the carpet install the interior had undergone some painting and rearranging. She wanted to thank all those that had helped to move furniture etc. for the project. Also thanks were given to Miller Bros Moving and Storage for storing all the furniture during the renovation time and O.L. Willards for the paint that was donated.

Afton stated that the library would be holding A Grand Monopoly Swap #3. She also thanked the Guilford Smith Library Board of Directors for approving her attendance at the Annual Library Association Conference.

There will be a Book and Bake Sale on Saturday, May10, 2014 from 9 a.m. to 2 p.m.

***Windham Free Library –***

Carol Santa Lucia presented the monthly report for the library. Ms. Santa Lucia noted that circulation had shown an increase. She also thanked the District for funding the new roof for the Dr. Hunt Chester Hunt Office. Ms. Santa Lucia stated that Town Officials had been out to check out the inside of the Hunt Office to ascertain what would need to be completed so that children and patrons could use the space.

The library continues deliver books to those who are home bound. Also Windham Center School had 19 classes come to the library and there were 25 books requested through the interlibrary loan system. She also stated that the library had donated magazines to Camp Horizons and to the residents of Douglas Manor.

The library is looking forward to a future collaboration with the Windham center Fire Department to read and give fire demonstrations to the children (tentative date May1). (see report)

President Diane Rayhall read a letter of concern sent to her by Joseph DeMarchi regarding the cost of the repairs and for the time that it took for the Dr. Chester Hunt Office.

***South Windham Fire Department Report –***

Chief John Chapman presented the report noting (53) calls for the month of April. There were (6) training sessions as well. (See Report) Chief Chapman thanked the district for this year's budget approval.

***Windham Center Fire Department –***

Chief Lloyd Niles presented the report noting (53) calls for the month with 36 of the calls being in Windham Center and (19) were mutual aid was given. There were (6) training sessions. Windham Center Fire Department attended Career Day at Windham Center School on April 11<sup>th</sup>. (see report)

***North Windham Fire Department –***

Chief John Wylie presented the report noting (36) calls for the month with (4) of the calls being mutual aid. There were (4) training sessions. (see report)

Chief Wylie advised everyone that the new thermal imaging cameras were in an being delivered to South Windham and Windham Center Fire Departments.

President Rayhall thanked the North Windham and Windham Center Fire Departments for inviting herself and Director Elaine Rogers to their Annual Dinners.

***Old Business –***

Chief John Wylie presented an estimate for the SCBA (self-contained breathing apparatus ) bottles that are needed because of expiration dates. As discussed in previous meeting the district has agreed to purchase the first installment of bottles for all the departments. They must now add a line item in their budgets to accommodate any future SBCA bottle purchases due to expiration. The quote presented was for (12) twelve Scott cylinder 4.5 45 minute carbon cylinder with valve at the cost of \$1,075.00 each for a total of \$12,900.00.

South Windham Fire Department President Michael Licata presented the quote for South Windham noting (10 ) ten SCBA bottles Scott cylinder 4.5 45 minute carbon cylinder with valve at the cost of \$1,082.00 each for a total of \$10,820.00. Discussion was held with regards to the price difference. It is noted that North Windham's quote is dated April 7, 2014 and South Windham's quote is dated April 30, 2014. A solid price will be available for the Special Meeting on June 2, 2014.

Motion made by Elaine Rogers, seconded by George Gillette to send the request for the SCBA bottle for both North Windham and South Windham to a Special Meeting on June 2, 2014 at 6p.m. not to exceed \$25,000.00. Motion accepted.

George Gillette question Chief Wylie if the bottles could be traded in. Chief Wylie explained that once they expire they cannot be used.

President Rayhall gave an update on Charter revision; she stated that language had been added to include the Windham First Taxing district. She also reminded everyone of the Budget Referendum on May 13, 2014.

***New Business –None***

Public comment – Gene Chaine questioned the SCBA bottle purchase. It was explained that the district was purchasing the first set of replacement bottles and that the department were to add a line item to their budgets for future expired bottles. He also questioned the calls and where they originate; how it is determined who gets sent to the calls. Chief Wylie stated that he felt that the fire departments were being ridiculed. Chief Niles invited Mr. Chaine to visit the dispatch center to get a first hand look at how the operation works. There was a lengthy discussion. Deputy Chief Mark Herrick explained how the mutual aid / automatic aid worked.

Windham Free Library announced a new President Barbara Gibson, Vice President Ellen Lang, also new to the Board are Marsha Hilsenrad and Kathy Miller.



**SCBA (AIR-PAK)**

**Key Changes to NFPA 1981/1982 SCBA Requirements**

**End-of-service Time Indicator (EOSTI)** will move from 25% to 33% (with a tolerance of -0%, +5% or 33% - 38%) of the cylinder's operating pressure.

The NFPA committee worked with NIOSH to establish minimum performance and approval requirements for Emergency Breathing Support Systems (EBSS), or "Buddy Breathers".

There will also be a universal PASS Alarm, so that all devices, regardless of the manufacturer, will have the same sound.




**What does this mean to you, as a fire department?**

The EOSTI increase from 25% to 33% was developed to increase the remaining air capacity once the low air alarm activates. However, this change will also reduce the total amount of working time available to the firefighter. Many departments, particularly those currently using 30-minute cylinders, may decide to increase the duration of their cylinders, to provide sufficient working time.

The use of Emergency Breathing Support Systems will be approved for use in an emergency situation. In the past, the units were approved to be on the SCBA but not approved for use. All PASS Devices will now sound the same and there will be more consistent alarms on the fire ground. It could reduce potential confusion in mutual aid situations. However, the new sound will be different from the current sound for any manufacturer.


